



AGRIBUSINESS TRAINING - KUNTAYA

In our branch at Kuntaya we offer six months courses in HORTICULTURE, POULTRY and SMALL RUMINANTS. Starting date is June 2021. The following subjects are part of the course:

- Theory
- Practical
- Mathematics
- English Communication
- Information Technology
- Entrepreneurship training
- Career Guidance / Enter the Labour Market Training.

The Insight Training Centre branch in Kuntaya is currently supported by the Tekki Fii project led by IMVF and Funded by the European Union. No training fees are requested to students in 2021.

The lessons will be given according to a time schedule. The schedule will change from time to time. During the training you will have 70% of practical lessons, whereby you acquire the needed practical skills. Attendance will be taken during all lessons and should be at least 90%. Examinations will be held at the end of November 2021. If all results are positive you will receive an Insight Certificate.

REQUIREMENTS

- Gambians between 15 – 35 years, who are seriously interested
- Grade 9 or grade 12 Certificate
- Being able to have lodging in or nearby Kuntaya
- High commitment to complete the 6 months training programme.

Returnees and female candidates are highly encouraged to apply.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

- Candidates can download an application form from www.insight.gm, collect a form from Insight in Kuntaya, Sinchu Alhagie or Churchill's Town (Serrekunda) or Regional Youth Office in Kerewan.
- At the above mentioned locations forms can be submitted. **Deadline is 7 May, 4 PM.**
- Applicants need to attach 2 passport size pictures, a copy of Birth Certificate or ID Card and a copy of School results (at least Grade 9).
- Insight will make a selection of applying candidates, based on proven requirements. Selected candidates will be called for an interview.
- Interviews will be held at Insight Training Centre in Kuntaya, North Bank Road, in the week of the 17th of May 2021.
- During the interview original ID/birth certificate and school results need to be shown.
- Selected persons will be informed by phone.

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WHAT WE EXPECT

Lessons can be given every day of the week, except Sunday, between 9 AM and 7 PM. Students are expected to be present at all subjects, all lessons. We expect students to follow our rules and regulations. In case of misbehaviour we will call parents, we might consider disciplinary measures.

Students Rules and Regulations

The students who are accepted in this centre are carefully selected and privileged. They should be proud of that fact. The reputation must be upheld. Students must set a good example in behaviour and personal appearance and are expected to conduct themselves sensibly and with decorum – both in and out of the centre, to portray themselves as respectable citizens of the future.

Starting times of classes is communicated in timetables per course. **Regular attendance and punctuality are of paramount importance.** Permission to examinations depend on satisfaction of attendance and performance. In case of illness or emergencies the lecturer should be informed about the reason of absence. Absenteeism will be subjected to suspension or expulsion.

General regulations

1. Cleanness of the ground, classrooms, workshop and toilets are a concern of every student.
2. Students are not allowed to bring or consume alcoholic beverages on the centre premises, nor food and foodstuff to the classroom.
3. Smoking in classrooms and within the school premises is strictly forbidden.
4. Use and sales of drugs (narcotics) is illegal.
5. Students must not make unnecessary noise, that may disturb class work.
6. Students will be liable for full replacement cost for any damage to the centre property. 50% for the inconvenience - dependent on the circumstances - may be disciplined.
7. The institute will not be held responsible for loss or damage of student's property. Students are advised not to bring valuable articles to the institute.
8. Students are not allowed to make or receive phone calls / messages in class time, except emergencies, outside the classroom.
9. Meetings addressed by outsiders must be cleared in advanced with the principal.
10. Students shall not sit on the street in front of the centre.
11. Students problems must be addressed to the lecturer.
12. After the last class ends, students must store machines and equipment.
